CRUISE INDONESIA

AGATS, PAPUA

Visit an area that still today is mostly untamed and was made famous through the art produced by the Asmat. Once welcomed ashore in Agats, see the Catholic church with its indigenous art and the outstanding collection of the local museum.

BANDA ISLANDS

Banda Neira and Pulau Run were centric to spice trade. Portuguese, Spaniards and English all tried to possess these islands, but it was finally the Dutch East India Company which had a monopoly on nutmeg and mace. Walk through Banda Neira to see stately homes, spice trees, Fort Belgica and Nassau. Run is more laid-back with its brightly coloured houses.



TRITON BAY, WEST PAPUA

In 2008, the Kaimana Regency declared a 6000 km² Marine Protected Area around the waters of Triton Bay. The bay offers beautiful beaches and the possibility to do Zodiac cruises along magnificent karst islands as well as to snorkel in this remote West Papuan area.

BAU-BAU

The main city on Buton Island is home to Benteng Keraton, the biggest fort in Indonesia built by a local sultan centuries ago. Made of coral blocks, the fort commands an excellent view over the city, port and the sea beyond. Inside the fort is the house of the former sultan, which today serves as a small private museum.

TANA TORAJA

Toraja culture centres on funeral ceremonies as an extremely important ritual. See villages where homes are adorned with the horns of buffalo sacrificed in funerals and walk past an ancient field of funeral ceremonies with more than 100 tall stones representing feasts of merit given in the past.

BELITUNG AND KARIMUNIWA

Snorkel in the clear waters and over healthy reefs of two archipelagos in the Java Sea. Practice water sports, go beachcombing or simply relax in the shade of palm trees.
